October marks Filipino American History Month (FAHM)—a time to honor the deep and enduring contributions of Filipino Americans to U.S. history and culture. Since 1992, the Filipino American National Historical Society (FANHS) has led the effort to celebrate this month nationwide. In 2009, FAHM was officially recognized by the U.S. Congress, and in 2015, President Obama hosted the first FAHM celebration at the White House.

This year, we are proud to share the official theme for FAHM 2025:

"From Quotas to Communities: Filipino American Migration and Movement".



Neurodivergent Belonging: Finding Your Shape (Pt.1) & Neurodivergent Belonging: Connecting with Other Shapes (Pt. 2)

Neurodivergent Belonging: Finding Your Shape (Pt.1): In this workshop, students will learn basic understanding of neurodiversity generally, and about themselves specifically, through completing a series of prompts and exercises to understand themselves and their needs. Students can expect to learn about their sensory needs, unique ways that their brains work, how their nervous systems respond to stimuli, and how they would like to be supported by others. Students may work on the prompts alone, with others, or take them to work on after the workshop.

Neurodivergent Belonging: Connecting with Other Shapes (Pt. 2): In this workshop, students will learn about beginning, building, and maintaining friendships in their own unique ways through a combination of instruction and exercise. Students can expect to learn about starting conversations without a reliance on neurotypical constructs such as small talk, "keeping things light," and inauthenticity. Students may work on the prompts alone, with others, or take them to work on after the workshop.


